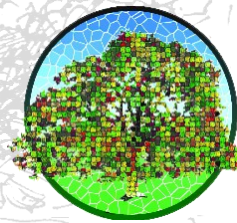

FREEZER BURN

If you've lived in Houston long enough this is not your first deep freeze rodeo. Despite our best attempts to protect plants outside, sustained temps in the teens are impossible to defend short of covering them with a styrofoam cooler and putting a candle inside. But don't panic, since our ground typically does not freeze, the roots of many plants will survive and reemerge. Woody plants like camellias may make it too although there will likely be leaf drop before new growth shows and it may be necessary to trim back the dead portions later. I would wait several weeks before calling it quits although I couldn't stand to look at the dark crisp leaves and cut some of my perennials to the ground. or pulled off the dead leaves on shrubs. Like it or not, this is Mother Nature's way of clearing away diseases and pests., perhaps even reducing the mosquito population. We will discover what is hardy in our gardens and maybe plant some more of those. And yet, I will plant again my old favorites and maybe some new ones. Tropical too. Yes, we could have another Northerner next year or next decade but don't deprive yourself of the joy you had in fear of what might come. It will take the nurseries a while to restock and prices may be high for a few months. Goodness knows we have come back from worse things.

Back then, we had a lot of house fires – about one every year, in fact. I remember standing outside in my pajamas, watching in horror as a neighbor's home and possessions diminished into cinders. There was an older home on Fargo – I want to say Fargo, but it could have been W. Drew ... but I think Fargo. Around Hopkins or maybe Whitney. It was a nicely enough maintained older home, divided into upstairs and downstairs apartments. I remember an "A" shaped peak over the roof. One night, the structure went up in flames. I don't recall if I was in my PJ's, but I remember standing on the sidewalk watching the fire race through the rooms. The home was reduced to charred studs and floorboards. There was no façade at all – you could look right into the rubble. The unbelievable thing is – a resident continued to live there! Either way, he holed up on the upper floor, under that peaked roof, now black and sooty, and remained there for several months, at least. HOUSTON ANNOUNCES MORATORIUM ON HEAVY TRASH CODE ENFORCEMENT IN AFTERMATH OF WINTER STORM

Heavy trash code enforcement suspended February 23 to March 12, 2021
No citations will be issued during this time

HOUSTON - Due to widespread damage to many homes during last week's winter storm, the Department of Neighborhoods (DON) Inspections and Public Service (IPS) division will suspend heavy trash code enforcement, effective immediately through Friday, March 12, 2021 to allow residents adequate time to clear debris from their properties. The department will resume heavy trash code enforcement on March 15, 2021.
