Security for the greater Houston area. As many in our neighborhood 6/21 - No Meeting – Summer Break know, we are seeing an uptick of crime, and would like to pursue getting a constable/security service in the East Montrose area. East Montrose has 7/19 - No Meeting – Summer Break around 880 homes in our area, which based on comments from James is the optimal size for a constable/security program. Unfortunately, we did 8/16—No Meeting – Summer Break not record the meeting, but here are some of the questions asked during the presentation. 9/15 - Home Tour Planning Why are we recommending a private security company like S.E.A.L. in-9/20 - Speaker stead of the county constable? 10/4 - National Nite Out – HPD & Elected Officials It is simply a timing issue. To use the county constable, we would have had to put a request in October, for the following calendar year. Using 10/15 - Home Tour Final Planning S.E.A.L. initially will not preclude us from changing to the County Constable next year, if this is what the neighborhood would like. S.E.A.L. can be 10/? - Biennial Home Tour (resched due to CV19) cancelled at any time once we have given 30 days notice. The cost of using the Constable and the cost of using S.E.A.L. are comparable. 11/15 – Speaker Will having S.E.A.L. as our constable/security reduce HPD response in 12/6 – Annual Elections/Holiday Party (tentative) **East Montrose?** To join Zoom Meetings: No, it will not. But it will ensure that you get a response from someone should you have a need during the patrol hours. #### resident is being threatened, they will use lethal weapons to prevent loss of life.

- · Officer presence
- · Verbal Commands
- Empty hand control
- Pepper Spray
- Hard Controls (Baton or Taser) less lethal
- · Deadly force

The S.E.A.L. officers do undergo training to handle the homeless and those with mental impairment.

#### How does this work with businesses in the neighborhood?

We are asking businesses to participate in the S.E.A.L. program because we see the businesses in our areas as partners with the homeowners. The S.E.A.L. program is not intended to be used as private security for any business, but as a tool to help deter crime. This benefits both businesses and homeowners alike.

#### Is there a handoff with HPD for prosecution if warranted?

Yes, there is a handoff, and S.E.A.L. will provide all documentation and details to help support prosecution, if warranted.

#### Can S.E.A.L. provide ticketing for moving violations like speeding of DUI's?

No, S.E.A.L. cannot provide tickets for moving violations but they do contact HPD for traffic violations such as speeding or running stop signs.

#### What other services will S.E.A.L. and the Constable Service provide?

- Dedicated 24-hour hotline operator will dispatch S.E.A.L.'s officer and call the police, fire or EMS if needed
- S.E.A.L. has an interpreter service that can translate over 200 languages to assist in any type of emergency
- A sign in your yard to help the patrol identify your home
- · Vacation Watch
- Home security inspections
- Support if your alarm goes off and you are or not home; you can list S.E.A.L. as your secondary contact with your alarm company
- · If your gate or door is open, they can come check that your house is empty and safe to enter.
- · If there is an unwanted person in your yard, S.E.A.L. officers are legally allowed to approach if warranted.
- GPS tracking of patrol every 4.5 minutes
- · Monthly reporting on the type of calls or activities S.E.A.L. is experiencing in East Montrose
- Monthly meeting with the security committee to discuss security related issues and adjust patrol times as needed
