Montrose TIRZ 27 and Redevelopment Authority propose \$52MM Montrose Boulevard Reconstruction

The Montrose Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone ("TIRZ") 27 and Redevelopment Authority are proposing a \$52MM roadway reconstruction of Montrose Boulevard from Allen Parkway to US-59. According to stated project objectives, the proposed plan aims to achieve improved roadway mobility and safety for all users, promote a more pedestrian-friendly environment, and improved drainage. The goal is to provide support for a growing Montrose neighborhood. The TIRZ 27/Montrose Redevelopment Authority Board introduced the proposed project at their December 12th meeting.

Segment I which is between West Clay St to Allen Parkway is anticipated to be in design phase until October 2023 with construction beginning December 2023. Estimated completion is Fall 2024. Segment II timing (US-59 to West Clay St) is still to be determined.

Movie: The Swimmers (on Netflix)

A beautifully made biopic recounting the events that lead two teenage sisters to flee wartorn Syria for Germany, where they continue to work towards their lifelong dream of swimming for Syria in the Olympics. This movie captures your attention and doesn't let go until the end credits roll. You'll leave with new, up close perspectives on the injustices of war on families, the difficulties faced by refugees each step of their journeys as they seek safety, and the challenges that come with dealing with government agencies in difficult situations. The adversities faced by these sisters, and the determination with which they faced them was truly remarkable to see.

Book: Chasing History: A Kid in the Newsroom by Carl Bernstein

A name you may be familiar with, Bernstein is coauthor of All the President's Men. Chasing History is his memoir, published last January. Bernstein recounts life as a teenager in the early 1960's—struggling to finish school in Washington, working as a copyboy at an afternoon newspaper, and working his way up to a self-taught career in journalism right in the thick of the civil rights era. It is a thrilling read, and one you won't want to put down.

Recipe of the Month

Try these decadent chocolate and hazelnut sandwiches by Chandra Ram when you celebrate love this month. If ever there was a time to break that New Years resolution, it is now!

Ingredients

I cup blanched hazelnuts

2 ounces 70% to 75% cacao dark chocolate baking bars , coarsely chopped (about 1/2 cup)

I/3 cup orange marmalade
(such as March Pantry)

I/4 cup fig jam(such as Dalmatia)

1/4 cup salted butter, softened

4 (1/2-inch-thick) slices challah

Flaky sea salt (such as Maldon), to taste

Directions

Heat a large skillet over medium. Add hazelnuts; cook, stirring often, until light golden and fragrant, 5 to 10 minutes. Remove from heat; let cool 5 minutes. Crush or coarsely chop. Stir together hazelnuts, chocolate, marmalade, and fig jam in a medium bowl. Set aside.

Spread butter evenly on 1 side of each challah slice. Place 2 slices, buttered side down, on a clean work surface; spread hazelnut mixture evenly on the 2 slices. Top with remaining 2 slices, buttered side facing up.

Heat a large skillet over low. Add sandwiches; cover and cook until golden on bottoms, about 3 minutes. Press with a spatula to flatten slightly, and flip sandwiches. Cover and cook until browned on other sides, about 3 minutes, reducing heat as needed if bread is browned before chocolate melts completely. Transfer sandwiches to a cutting board, and cut in half. Sprinkle with salt to taste, and serve.
