

Update on Safe Routes To School

Info from the May 19 TIRZ meeting:

- Montrose Safe Routes to School is the project that aims to enhance safety and accessibility for students and parents walking and biking to schools in East and North Montrose. It includes new sidewalks and stop signs in East Montrose.
- There is discussion between Montrose TIRZ and Fourth Ward TIRZ about potentially expanding the project to the Fourth Ward, to include the area near Gregory Lincoln Elementary and Carnegie Vanguard High School. Details TBD.
- Funding previously allocated to extending the Waugh Drive bike lanes has been diverted to Safe Routes to **replace sidewalks on more streets**, this time mostly in East Montrose. From the map presented at the meeting, this looks like some north/south blocks between Bomar and Willard, and some east/west blocks between Willard and Fargo.
- More studies to determine exactly which streets get these additional sidewalks will delay the project. The new projected start time is **January 2026** and will take one year.
- This project also includes a crosswalk with a pedestrianactivated blinking light at Stanford and W. Gray, to help students cross over to Wharton Elementary safely.
- A 90% plan is projected to be presented to the city at the end of June.
- While the TIRZ Board previously committed to holding a public meeting late last year, this is now planned for late July unfortunately a time when key stakeholders like families with school-aged kids may be traveling. We will share public meeting details when available.

3. Houston Pride: The 47th annual Pride parade and festival will take place in downtown Houston, organized by Pride Houston 365. Get ready for live entertainment, food, vendors of all kinds, concerts, DJs, Family Fun Zones, exhibitions, and the highlight of it all—the parade! The festivities will run all day 11AM-10PM with the parade starting at 7PM.

June 28th at Houston City Hall, tickets required for the festival, free entry for the parade

4. Juneteenth Freedom Fest: A free, family friendly event bringing together seven historic Black communities of Houston to celebrate the 160th anniversary of Juneteenth by featuring the rich culture and honoring the pioneers of Juneteenth.

June 1 at Emancipation Park, 1pm-7PM

5. **Tokyo X Festival:** Over 400 vendors will arrive to showcase Japanese culture, with incredible displays including car shows, concerts, arcade games, samurai culture, martial arts, voice actors, food, drinks, workshops of all kinds, and more! After parties and cosplay events after hours.

Taking up residence at the Elro location (2405 Genesee) this newly dubbed Cecil's 2.0 will feature a full kitchen so we can expect a new menu, including bar bites and pizzas. There is also a cocktail menu in development, though no news on what will be served. The draft list will drop from 16 beers to just a few due to a lack of walk-in cooler space, but the food and cocktail menus will surely make up for that. Yard of the Season...

Our Yard of the Season home from April through June 2025 is the contemporary- looking home at 613 Welch. The occupants of the home actually represent three generations! Jacqueline, Allison, and Irene share their home with their two cats — Domino and Boots. The family has lived in East Montrose for two years, having moved from Corpus Christi. They are not new to our area though. Jaqueline and Allison lived here for 20 years back in the seventies and eighties.

They restored and redesigned the entire front of the home, even changing the entrance from north-facing to east-facing. The front yard is a small, nicely land-scaped charmer with Japanese yews, seating, garden pottery, and new landscape lighting to add interest. Even the easement on Welch received a makeover with black rock, small crepe myrtles, (added to the huge ones already there) and low-growing juniper ground cover. The backyard has also been completely redone.

Recipe of the Month

There were too many recipes to choose from for summer seasonals but we finally settled on <u>Jalapeno Cheddar Popovers with Honey Butter!</u> Pop these out for your next summer brunch and wow your guests. Recipe by Tieghan Gerard

Ingredients

- 2 tablespoons + 3 teaspoons salted butter
- I I/2 cups whole milk, at room temperature
- 3 large eggs, at room temperature
- I 1/2 cups all purpose flour
- I/4 cup grated cheddar cheese

- I jalapeño, seeded and finely chopped
- I teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/2 teaspoon onion powder
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 4 tablespoons salted butter, at room temperature
- 3 tablespoons honey

Instructions:

- 1. Heat 2 tablespoons butter in a small skillet over medium heat and cook the butter until it begins to bubble, then brown, 3-4 minutes.
- 2. Position a rack in the lower third of the oven. Preheat the oven to 450 degrees. Place 1/2 teaspoon of butter in each cup of a 6 cup standard popover pan. Alternately, you can use a 12-cup muffin pan and make 10 mini popovers. Place the pan on a baking sheet and then into the oven to melt the butter, 3-5 minutes.
- 3. In medium bowl, vigorously whisk together the milk and eggs until frothy, about I minute. Add the browned butter, flour, salt, onion powder and garlic powder. Whisk in the cheddar and jalapeño. It's OK if there are small lumps.
- 4. Remove the popover pan from the oven and swirl the butter around the cups to grease the pan. Evenly divide the batter between the popover cups, filling them about 3/4 of the way full. Bake for 20 minutes. Lower the oven temperature to 350 degrees. Bake another 10-20 minutes, until deeply golden.
- 5. Meanwhile, make the honey butter. In a small bowl, combine the butter, honey, and a pinch of flaky sea salt. Serve the popovers warm with honey butter and flaky salt.
