





We're glad to see that Freedman's Town's restoration is finally coming along at a good clip and were lucky to be included on a tour of the Yates Museum. The Yates museum doesn't have regular hours and is used for archaeology students and school tours. One room is packed with information about African American inventors receiving patents not long after Emancipation. We learned more about the famous brick streets - some portions (which the city hasn't mangled) are amazingly straight - the former slaves had been the ones doing all the work before Emancipation, so they had the skills to do superb work.

Last year a docudrama was released, The 24th, which is set in 1917 in Freedman's Town and Camp Logan (now Memorial Park). It's curious to see how the film makers depicted life so close to our neighborhood since many of the houses in East Montrose were already standing in 1917.

Here's something I never knew about before ... a Walgreens "outpost" on Montrose Blvd.

This is a tiny facility a block to the north of the full-sized store on Hawthorne. I haven't been there myself, but am relaying information from a friend who visited. So check it out for yourself. But the skinny is that it's like a mini space for fast, simple pharmacy transactions. It's basically a service window, with enough indoor waiting area for 2-3 customers (depending on social distancing). It's like a drive-through, but without the car. Call ahead, and your prescription will be ready when you arrive. You might be able to call a prescription in to your regular location, and then have them dispense it at this little outlet. By appointment, you can get shots here, too, and COVID vaccines (but only one – I forget which is available here). No long lines, no waiting – because no one knows about it! Shhh!

I was driving home from Spec's about 4:00 one afternoon, approaching Taft, and noticed a HUGE traffic backup on W. Gray. In fact, the entire outside lane was packed with stationary cars, reducing the traffic flow to just one lane westbound. This went on for blocks. Whaaatha?? Turns out Carnegie Vanguard High School lets out about that time, and the moms and nannies drive over and line up to pick up their kids. Gee, I always thought that high-schoolers got to class on their own. But, with Carnegie's Gifted and Talented program, the kids are drawn from all over the city. So buses, bicycles, and foot-power make way for the good old fashioned car pool. CVG High School, BTW, along with Wharton, also on W. Gray, are unique gems of education that offer special programs ... We're blessed to have both these schools right here in East Montrose.
