It makes me cry just thinking about moving because Casa de Peden has been my pride and joy. I feel lucky every day to live here. But now I have to consider the future. If everything goes as planned, I will close on my new place later this month. First I have to have a chair-lift installed so that Mom can get upstairs, and I want to make some other minor changes We will then slowly start moving in to the new place. There is going to be some very upset chihuahuas and one very upset fat rat terrier, but they will have to get over it. I will then make some minor repairs on Casa de Peden before I put her on the market to sell. I will NOT sell her to a builder. It would literally break my heart to see her torn down. Moving away will be hard enough, watching her get torn down would be more than I could bear. I know that I can't control her future much, but I'm going to try. She's made it almost 100 years already!

I tried to be as involved as much as I could be in EM over the years. I am a past president of EMCA. I created the Facebook group. I've been the newsletter editor for eight years. I deliver the newsletters on Peden. I've had Casa de Peden on the home tour twice. I'm leaving the newsletter editing in good hands. Sofie Shoaib has generously agreed to take over the duties, so this will be the last edition with me as the editor. Bill Maxey has been co-admin of the East Montrose Facebook page for years, so that is covered as well. I do need someone to take over my delivery of newsletters once a quarter to Peden and one block of Stanford!

Living in East Montrose has been a wonderful chapter in my life. I will dearly miss living here, and all of the great friends that I've made. I plan to keeping adding my 2 cents worth on the Facebook group, though, unless Bill blocks me from the group!
